

COURSE LEVELS AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At college, you can choose between a wide-range of courses that start at different levels. Each course will have different entry requirements based on GCSE grades and potentially your experience. Take a look at what qualifications are available at different levels and their common entry requirements*.

ENTRY LEVEL Ideal if you don't have any existing qualifications and want to develop basic skills and knowledge.

COMMON ENTRY REQUIREMENTS*

Five GCSEs at grade 4-9 including English Language and Maths**

Successful completion of a relevant Level 2 course

LEVEL 4+ Equivalent to a foundation degree, and the first, second and third year of a 'traditional' undergraduate degree. If university isn't right for you, you can opt to study a Higher National Certificate, Higher National Diploma, Higher Technical Qualification or higher apprenticeships as alternatives. Whilst this isn't something you need to pick now, our Derby Road campus is home to Nottingham Trent University in Mansfield which means you can progress onto higher-level qualifications without having to go far.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Specific to the individual university and/or course.




