
### **HOW TO LOG YOUR VOLUNTEERING HOURS**

Open ProPortal in the usual way.

1. Click on the 'Student ILP' Menu.



2. Select 'Job Ready, Enrichment' from the bottom of the menu.




3. There is a green bar which contains filter options, the default is for the bar to be minimised.



If you wish to filter your enrichment click on the two arrows at the right end of the bar to expand the filter menu.

4. Click 'Add New' to open the box. A pop up appears. If you change your mind about adding anything, click the cross at the top right of the pop up, otherwise follow the on screen prompts.



Enter the date of the volunteering in the format dd/mm/yyyy.

5. In the activity box, briefly describe what the volunteering activity was, for example 'Supervising a Beaver football match'.


Remember to check your spelling and grammar.

6. In the comments box enter any comments you think are relevant.

There were 10 teams each playing against one another. My role was to ensure the team I was assigned got to the right pitch at the right time.

7. In the category menu drop down carefully select 'Volunteering'.



- 8. In the next part about hours. Only tutors can click the check box to include 'Include Non-timetabled EEP Hours', so you can ignore that.
- 9. If you are putting your volunteering in well before it takes place you need to enter how many hours you think you will be doing in the planned hours box and ignore the actual hours box.

When you actually do the volunteering you need to revisit this activity and enter the actual hours in the 'Actual Hours' box.
